 - (b) Analyse how Christiana Rossetti presents the themes of temptation and sin in her poem An Apple Gathering.
 - (c) Comment on Hopkin's use of the concepts of 'inscape' and 'instress' in *Pied Beauty*.

 - (a) Discuss the influence of liberalism and Feminism on the novels of Victorian England.
 - (b) Discuss how utilitarianism and material outlook were criticised in Victorian non-fictional prose.
