- 1. Attempt any one of the following questions: 10×1
 - (a) Write a note on the impact of the fading away of the Empire on English society.

(b) What, in your view, constitutes "modernism" in "modern" British poetry? Discuss.

2. Attempt any one of the following questions: 15×1

- (a) Do you consider Jim as a romantic figure in Lord Jim? Give reasons for your answer.
- (b) Consider the allegorical significance of Lord of the Flies.
- (c) Bring out the contrast between Ralph and Jack in Lord of the Flies.
- (d) To what extent is the protagonist's life shaped by his sense of guilt in Lord Jim? Discuss.
- 3. Attempt any one of the following questions: 10×1
 - (a) Write a note on the portrait of the Boss in The Fly.
 - (b) Comment on the title of Lawrence's short story, The White Stocking.

- (c) Write a note on Joyce's use of symbols in Araby.
- 4. Attempt any one of the following questions: 15×1
 - (a) "The Wild Swans at Coole, like many poems of Yeats, is concerned with the anguish of mortality." Discuss.
 - (b) 'Eliot's preoccupation with the nature of the self is central to a reading of *The Love Song of J. Alfred Prufrock'*. Discuss.
 - (c) Consider *Poem in October* as a reflection on the fecundity of Nature.
- 5. Attempt any one of the following questions: 10×1
 - (a) "And this full view/Indeed may enter/
 And move in memory as now these clouds do ..." Describe and comment on the "full view" mentioned above.
 - (b) "The Thought Fox is a poem about writing a poem"—Discuss.

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- (c) "Do memories plague their ears like flies"? Explain with reference to the poem At Grass.
- 6. Attempt any one of the following questions: 15×1
 - (a) Consider Shaw's Pygmalion as "a play of ideas".
 - (b) Comment on the significance of the title of the play, Look Back in Anger.
 - (c) Discuss the use of symbols in Waiting for Godot.
- 7. Answer any three of the following questions: 5×3
 - (a) Strange Meeting is concerned with "The pity of war, the pity war distilled" Discuss.
 - (b) "I thought every German was you"—Comment on the speaker's state of mind.
 - (c) Comment on the way Wilson dies in The Lotos Eater.

- (d) What was the boy's "chalice" in Araby? How did he carry it?
- (e) Comment on the relevance of the myth of Pygmalion in the play of that name.
- (f) Write a short note on the game of bear and squirrel in Look Back in Anger.
