- (c) How does Shaw define Heaven and Hell in Man and Superman? Would you consider Tanner a 'heavenly' personality?
- (d) How does Shaw dramatize the idea of Life Force in Man and Superman?
- 2. Answer any *one* of the following (within 300 words): 10×1
 - (a) Critically examine Wilde's handling of the theme of dual identity in *The Importance of Being Earnest*.
 - (b) Is The Importance of Being Earnest "a trivial comedy for serious people"? Give a reasoned answer.
 - (c) Examine the role of the Chorus in Murder in the Cathedral.
 - (d) Comment on the relevance of the Knights' speeches after the murder of Thomas Becket.

- 3. Answer any *one* of the following (within 300 words): 10×1
 - (a) Write a note on Pinter's use of language in *The Birthday Party*.
 - (b) The Birthday Party centres on a non-conformist individual's search for security. Do you agree? Substantiate your answer.
 - (c) Critically assess the pronouncements made on 'life' and 'death' in Stoppard's Rosencrantz and Guildenstern are Dead.
 - (d) Comment on the theme of identity and existence in stoppard's Rosencrantz and Guildenstern are Dead.
- 4. Comment on any *two* of the following (within 100 words): 5×2
 - (a) (i) "I mean that I was simply transferred from father's hands into yours. You arranged everything according to your own taste, and so I got the same tastes as you—"
 - (ii) Ramsden as a foil to Tanner in 'Man and Superman'.

- (b) (i) The pun in the title of Wilde's The Importance of Being Earnest.
 - (ii) Significance of The Interlude in Murder in the Cathedral.
- (c) (i) The breaking of Stanley's glasses in The Birthday Party.
